

James Otis, PhD



Dr. James Otis is an Associate Professor in the Department of Neuroscience at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC). His laboratory seeks to understand how neural circuits guide motivated behavioral states in health and disease, with a primary focus on substance use disorders. То approach this objective, his lab develops novel behavioral paradigms for rodents that enable state-of-the-art tools to be applied for the study of

reward- and addiction-related behaviors, such as two-photon calcium imaging, single-cell holographic optogenetics, and spatial transcriptomics. In addition to his scientific endeavors, Dr. Otis has a strong interest in mentorship and training of others. He co-developed the MUSC Internship for Distinguished Scholars (MINDs) program, which provides financial support for students at the university and postbaccalaureate levels who wish to gain experience in neuroscience research but may not have the means to do so.

Clintin Davis-Stober, PhD



Dr. Davis-Stober is a Professor of Psychological Sciences and a Core Faculty member of the Institute for Data Science and Informatics at the University of Missouri. He holds a PhD in Quantitative Psychology and an M.S. in Mathematics from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Dr. Davis-Stober is a quantitative and mathematical psychologist that specializes in decision theory.

His primary research topic is the development and evaluation of

mathematical models of individual and group decision-making. His recent work examines how individuals integrate multiple pieces of information when making a decision and the rationality of various decision strategies.
